39. An American World War Two flying ace who later, as a Test pilot, was the first person to break the Sound Barrier.  
...Chuck Yeager.....
40. An English Actor and Comedian probably best known as one of "The Goodies" and as a regular panellist on "I'm sorry I haven't a clue".

41. An Argentinian professional footballer and manager rated as one of the best players of all time although the English remember him for his use of a hand!
